## Adult – Trauma

**Kartik Prabhakaran, MD**, Chief of Trauma and Acute Care Surgery, has announced a 2022 Trauma synopses for the Trauma and Acute Care Section.

"The Adult Trauma Program at Westchester Medical Center treated over 5,600 patients in 2022. Of these, over 2,300 were admitted to our hospital for further evaluation. Falls were the leading cause of injury resulting in admission, with motor vehicle accidents being second. 95% of injuries stemmed from blunt trauma and 5% from penetrating trauma."

#### Stop the Bleed: From Bystanders to First Responders – NBC New York

The Injury Prevention Program has held over 15 **Stop the Bleed** classes during 2021 and 2022 resulting in over 250 individuals trained in bleeding control, to provide early intervention in the event of a severe bleed.

**GERIATRICS:** In an effort to prevent the on-going falls issue in older adults, the Injury Prevention program established a fall prevention screening initiative based on the CDC's STEADI algorithm. Over 400 patients are now enrolled and approximately 70 patients consented into our novel Geriatric Fall Prevention Program.

The Injury Prevention Program will be collaborating with our Adult and Pediatric Trauma Program to institute a **Motorcycle** & ATV Safety event this spring, as well as a **Distracted Driving Program**, early this fall teaming up with local schools. On December 14, 2022, HealthAlliance Hospital Broadway Campus officially moved all in-patients and their Emergency Department patients to the new state-of-the-art HA location on Mary's Avenue in Kingston.

At 0600 the transfer of ALL ED patients to the new Mary's Avenue campus ED with 79 patients safely and carefully transferred within 12 hours!

The ED portion took about five hours and two EDs were maintained until the last patient was transferred. If you have not toured the new hospital yet be sure to get a tour!

**Gigi Madore, MD,** Chair, Emergency Medicine, HAHV, announced HA has applied for Level III Trauma designation status which is expected to be approved later this year.

Dr. Madore stated "New upgrades at HA include the new ED ICU, cath lab and L&D along with renovated med surg units all are complete! These new enhancements mean decreased wait times for our EMS crews and a higher level of care". We're now using the Fast Track space for low acuity patients and is now contiguous with the Main ED, allowing for greater flexibility of resources.
